## A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR & CEO

In this financial period CCA continued providing support, investing in research and creating awareness across a broad audience through events and activities.

After many years of lobbying, the Federal Department of Health has recognised CCA as a professional peak patient body with the capabilities to deliver a large scale national project that will favourably impact all IBD patients as well as the Australian economy. This recognition was realised through a \$500,000 matched funding grant for the implementation of IBD Audits in 100 Australian hospitals. Hospitals will be audited against a set of IBD Standards of Care that are endorsed by all the major Australian health bodies that work with IBD patients. The partnership we now have with the Federal Department of Health firmly places IBD on the government's radar as a condition that requires serious investment.

We continue to enjoy a strong relationship with the Victorian Department of Health which has maintained funding for our Volunteer Teams and Peer Support Program. This program has grown in geographic reach and numbers in Victoria and has sparked interest from members in other states who want to start a local program. In the next few years, we will work with our members to secure funding in each State to implement the Volunteer Teams and Peer Support Program nationally.

As our program offerings grow, so too have our staffing and office accommodation needs. This year, CCA has increased its investment in specialised skills to deliver high quality programs and improved customer service to our members. We are also excited that we are now housed in our new national office at Camberwell and are poised for growth.

And while we continue to invest in research via the Angela McAvooy Fellowship, we were also delighted to announce the establishment of the Mandy & Edward Yencken Postgraduate Research Fellowship. We are grateful to the Yencken family for making this grant possible and look forward to announcing the inaugural recipient in December 2014.

Our governance structure was strengthened this year with the recruitment of two new directors with commercial experience in finance and medical expertise in the area of IBD. We welcome our new directors Professor Paul Pavli and Mr Philip Picking who have already made a positive contribution to the governance of CCA with their specialised skills and wish to acknowledge the hard work and drive of all other Board members.

In 2014, CCA has had its best revenue generating year on record. In spite of this, the bulk of the funds received are tied to projects that are yet to commence or complete in 2014. Such funds are treated as unearned revenue in our financial statements and as a result, 2014 ended with an accounting loss. Despite this, CCA is in good financial health and remains in a strong position to fund critical programs and research grants.

In the last few months, CCA, has been developing a roadmap for the organisation that supports sustainable growth, effective services and high impact research. To this end, CCA has been exploring revenue generating ideas that can potentially yield substantial untied funds that will allow for innovation and long term operational sustainability.

As always, CCA is grateful for the support it receives from so many. On behalf of the Board, we would like to take this opportunity to thank our members, donors, volunteers, sponsors, parliamentary friends and funders and CCA staff whose commitment and passion have helped drive a very successful year.

He is a senior lecturer in the Department of Medicine Monash University and supervises research students.

Dr Moore is also a member of Australian Inflammatory Bowel Disease Association, the peak medical IBD group, and is a sought after speaker at both scientific and public forums.

### Professor Paul Pavli

#### DIRECTOR

Professor Paul Pavli trained in Gastroenterology at Concord and Royal North Shore Hospitals in Sydney and has had an ongoing interest in the basic science and clinical aspects of the inflammatory bowel diseases. He has a PhD in gastrointestinal immunology and worked with researchers from the ANU, to establish the Australian Familial IBD Register in the early 1990s. More recently, he has been studying the role of bacteria in triggering IBD. In parallel he has helped develop a clinical service in IBD at Canberra Hospital where patients have access to all facets of treatment.

Paul has also served on a number of Federal and Territory government bodies and professional organizations.

### Sophia Tzaferis



# OUR YEAR IN PICTURES







# GOING FORWARD

## STRATEGIC PLAN – 2015 – 2018

For almost 30 years, CCA has worked hard to become Australia's peak patient body, delivering much needed research funding, advocacy, support and education at a grass roots level.

However, our impact has been limited due to lack of scale and fluidity of donations.

A predicted increase to 100,000 of those diagnosed with IBD by the end of the decade has compelled the Board to enact an aggressive and 'disruptive' strategy to help CCA meet the growing needs of patients and their families.

Our ambitious approach will require hard, dedicated work

over the next few years and involve not only the Board, management and staff of CCA, but volunteers, ambassadors, health professionals, government and corporate partners. With staff supported volunteers we will educate the general public and cement our position as the key influencer to government on behalf of the IBD community

A powerful impact statement underpins this plan and will drive the four key strategic priorities, as identified below, which have well-thought out enablers and clear metrics. With this plan to guide us, we can be assured we are on the right path as innovative care providers that research, develop and deliver evidence based, cutting edge support solutions for the IBD community.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

CCA continued investing in research and creating awareness across a broad audience through events and activities.


Although a \$185,793 deficit was recorded and Total Revenue shows a \$71,327 decrease over the 2013 financial year, CCA has had its most successful year ever in obtaining revenue.

Grants in Advance of \$550,000 and Unearned Revenue of \$73,150 are recorded in the Balance Sheet and will be recognised when costs are incurred in future year's Statement of Income and Expenditure.

The \$185,793 deficit is due to:


- Increased employment expenses, including recognising Long Service Leave for the first time.
- Timing of tied (Pharmaceutical) sponsorships received which has partially been offset by increased Donations and Government Grants
- Increased rent, and re-location expenses
- Ensuring tied grant revenue is matched with the period the cost is incurred.

The Board is carefully monitoring all operations to position CCA well in the future and is confident that CCA will return to surplus position in the next financial year.
