Code of Conduct

We want everyone who uses YEP! Online to have a great time in a positive and safe online environment where their rights are protected.

If you have questions about some of the things, we ask you to do or not to do, listed below, just ask us!

After you have read this Code of Conduct and feel that you understand and agree with what we are asking you to do and not to do, you can tick your agreement on the registration web-page. Without the tick you can't be registered, so contact us to talk about any concerns.

YEP! Online users are expected to:

- Contribute to an inclusive, supportive, and friendly atmosphere of the service.
- Actively participate in the blog discussions and other YEP! Online activities such as special Zoom meetings.
- Respect the dignity, diversity of cultures, backgrounds, and family customs of all individuals at YEP! Online.
- Always use appropriate language (no swearing, name calling or offensive language), free of hate speech, racism, and other forms of offensive content.
- Treat other participants with the same respect you want for yourself (that includes the blog moderators).
- Never share personal information (full name, address, phone, or email) while using YEP! Online.
- Never share your YEP! Online password.
- Never share your other social media profiles or identities using the YEP! Online blog.
- Never refer people from YEP! Online directly to other social sites to meet online.
- Never threaten or intimidate others.
- Never share content (photos, cartoons, links, comments) that are offensive in nature.

What happens if I get it wrong on YEP! Online?

If you post something that is not appropriate our moderators will take it down, then we'll contact you, so you understand what was wrong.

If we can't work things out we'll have to cancel your registration with YEP! Online.

There are also some things that we must notify to police to keep children safe.
